Re: Membership of the British Dance Council

With reference to your letter of the 11th January and in particular to the last paragraph of that letter and our recent telephone conversations. May I first of all apologise for the apparent delay in replying. You will however appreciate that such a serious matter can only be discussed at a meeting of Directors and after consultation with many interested parties.

We are all deeply concerned at the deteriorating situation within the British Dance world and feel that it is fast spiralling out of control. All dancers are thoroughly confused and do not want to be caught up in what is developing into a political power struggle. The Directors, at a recent meeting, have therefore decided that, notwithstanding their previous concerns, EADA should, in the interests of stability and in order to properly represent those English dancers, accept your offer to reconsider our position and rejoin the British Dance Council forthwith. It will of course be necessary to complete the documentation and remit the appropriate fees.

We have managed to keep the peace in this island for many years and unless we can begin to talk again and attempt to resolve differences without the interference of both National pride and World domination, our hobby and your business will be permanently damaged or even destroyed.
