

Couples, who wish to attend an overseas competition as private individuals and not at the invitation of EADA, must make their own travel arrangements including any visas and insurances.

Please inform the Travel Representative prior to travelling for two reasons:

1. The Travel Representative will check the IDSF web page for "unregistered events" to ensure that no EADA member is travelling to a banned competition.

The couple can also check this information on:

Please remember to verify the status of the competition on the above web page before arranging travel to avoid any potential disappointment.

If the event is an "unregistered event", then the Travel Representative will advise the couple not to attend. The Travel Representative will also inform the President and Executive Committee.

If the couple ignore the advice of the Travel Representative, or does not notify EADA of their intent to attend, then any subsequent action by any governing body cannot be attributed to EADA or the Travel Representative.

2. In order to complete in an IDSF event, the individuals are required have a current active IDSF registration number. The Travel Representative will check the status of the registration and advise the individuals of their registration number as appropriate. If the individuals do not have an active registration then the Travel Representative will arrange for them to be registered.

If the competition is a "registered IDSF event" then it is requested that a report on the competition is prepared and sent, with any photographs, to the EADA Publicity Officer at publicity@eada.org.uk

Please also remember to make sure you have a valid passport, and arranged any travel visa, an E111 medical card and adequate travel insurance cover (we advise you to check your policy to ensure you are covered for competitions) before travelling.
